



Gailė Sakalaitė-Orlovskienė, Member, EUIPO Legal Department; Leader, Designs Legislative Reform Team

Gailė Sakalaitė-Orlovskienė studied Intellectual Property law in TU Dresden (Germany) and CEIP (France) and has obtained an LL.M degree in International Studies in Intellectual Property law.

Since 2006 she worked for a law firm and a university technology transfer centre where she gained experience providing advice for start-ups and scientists on their intellectual property assets and contributed to the establishment of national university technology transfer guidelines.

After having joined the EUIPO in 2011 she worked as trade marks and designs examiner drafting trade mark opposition, cancellation and design invalidity decisions and as a litigator representing the EUIPO before the General Court in a number of design and trade mark cases.

Currently Gailė is part of the Legal Department and leads the Designs Reform Team responsible for providing support to the European Commission in reforming EU designs legislation and for implementing the upcoming new law into EUIPO operations. She is also a long standing SQAP (Stakeholder Quality Assurance Panel) expert and a member of the Knowledge Circle 'Designs', as well as a litigator representing EUIPO before the European Court of Justice.
