Christine Bonvallet has served as Director of the Patent Cooperation Treaty (PCT) International Cooperation Division, PCT Legal and International Affairs Department, Patents and Technology Sector of the World Intellectual Property Organization (WIPO) in Geneva, Switzerland, since 2020.

In her role, Ms. Bonvallet is responsible for promoting a better understanding of the PCT among Offices' staff, Intellectual Property (IP) practitioners and users covering *inter alia* operational, including substantive patent examination, technical, legal and training activities, contributing to the efficient functioning of the PCT. Her division is responsible for the development and the implementation of cooperation (technical assistance: impactful awareness raising and capacity building) activities to PCT Member States in their various capacities and States considering accession to the PCT.

She is a frequent speaker on PCT and WIPO matters, and often represents the PCT and WIPO at meetings at national and international levels promoting IP and innovation.

A national of France and Switzerland, Ms. Bonvallet joined WIPO in 2003. Prior to her current role, she has served several legal roles at WIPO, all within the Patents and Technology Sector that administers the PCT.

She is a lawyer by training specialized in intellectual property matters and international law. Ms. Bonvallet received two Masters of Laws in International Law and Intellectual Property Law from Panthéon-Assas University in Paris, France. She is a member of the Paris Bar Association (*Ordre des Avocats de Paris, France*), and has worked as a litigation and corporate lawyer for several business national and international law firms in Paris (e.g. Baker & McKenzie), France, and as in-

house legal IP-counsel for Paris-based multinationals (e.g. Sony Music, Thales Group), before joining WIPO.
